DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English, St. Joseph's College for Women (A) Visakhapatnam, one of the oldest Departments in the College which started since the inception of the College in 1958 offers B.A. Programme with three major combinations namely, English Language & Literature, Psychology, Office Management (EPO), English Language & Literature Psychology Journalism & Mass Communication (EPJ) and English Language & Literature Economics, Political Science (EEP). The Department also offers General English and as part of General Education it offers Communication & Soft Skills for three semesters for all groups of students.

Literary study explores how writers from a vast array of cultural traditions be it Indian, British or American have used the creative resources of language in fiction, poetry, drama, and non-fiction prose to explore the entire range of human experience. The practice of reading literary texts exercises the imagination, cultivates a capacity for understanding ambiguity and complexity, and instils sensitiveness to the diversities of human existence. Studying literature at the college level encourages all graduates of the College to get deeper insights into challenging and imaginative texts which add to the joy of a life-long commitment to learning.

The General English Course is meant to enhance the English skills of the young learners through standard texts – prose and poetry whereas the General Education Course on Communication and Soft Skills makes them confident, communicative and well prepared for future careers.

Vision

The Department of English Language and Literature seeks to fosters the intellectual development of its majors by encouraging study of literature and writing -whether, technical or other professional writing along with the needs of general education diversity, and global perspectives with those of the majors

Mission

The overall mission of the English Department is to promote literacy--specifically the ability to read, write, and think critically and strengthens the liberal education of students by developing a deepened understanding of language and literacy, the value of critical reading and effective writing, and the richness of literature, past and present.

- **4.** *Problem solving and Innovation (PI):* Competencies in quantitative and qualitative techniques. Graduates are expected to develop skills on analyzing specific data or problems, apply the relevant analysis, generate alternatives and engage in problem solving in functional or practical areas

Assessment Methodology

PSO 1: Identify, analyse, interpret and describe the critical ideas, values, and themes that appear in literary and cultural texts and understand the way these

ideas, values, and themes inform and impact on culture and society, both now and in the past.

Direct method of computing PSO 1 attainment is based on the student performance in all assessment instruments namely online and offline - subjective and objective tests for all the courses offered (ELL1201, ELL2201 ELL3201, ELL4201 ELL5201, ELL5202 ELL6201, ELL-A1-6201, ELL-A2-6202, ELL-A3-6203) These exams test students' learning at knowledge, understanding and application levels in the respective courses. Indirect method of computing PSOs is done through students' course exit survey wherein a structured questionnaire is administered to the students and their response is solicited on a 5-point scale. Responses are consolidated and students' satisfaction level with reference to course transaction is computed. Average percentage of level of attainments of all the courses in English Language & Literature is given below.

Overall level of Attainment for PSO1 is; 83.4%

PSO 2: Develop the ability to read works of literary, rhetorical, and cultural criticism, and deploy ideas from these texts in their own reading and writing. They will express their own ideas as informed opinions that are in dialogue with a larger community of interpreters and understand how their own approach compares to the variety of critical and theoretical approaches using analytical thinking and research aptitude.

They write critical reviews of secondary sources (articles from outside their core curriculum) (ELL1201, ELL3201, ELL4201, ELL-A1-6201, ELL-A2-6202, ELL-A3-6203)

Attainment level is ascertained based on continuous assessment (throughout) and summative assessment (at the end of) in every semester. This direct assessment involves testing students' knowledge on content and competencies, by giving them activities like article writing, paper presentations which are assessed.

Attainment of **PSO 2** is through

◆ In Semester I – Elizabethan and Milton Age, to develop an ardent interest in English
 Literature, each student is given a choice of topics (writings of Authors outside the

prescribed curriculum) and she researches on the topic and presents a critique from her own understanding of the writer and his or her works.

◆ In Semester VI – Literary Appreciation and Practical Criticism students have to choose a genre which they would like to specialise in future, they critically evaluate and write an appreciation of the work of the author. This Mini Project makes them versatile in specific academic writing as well as comparative understanding of the various authors of different genres.

Overall level of Attainment for PSO 2: 84.9%

PSO 3: Write effectively for a variety of professional and social settings in multiple contexts. They will practice writing as a process of motivated inquiry, engaging other writers' ideas as they explore and develop their own consequent to close reading, intertextual analysis. They will demonstrate an ability to revise for content and edit for grammatical and stylistic clarity. Appreciation of various genres and writings is something that will help the students to become writers with their own identity.

Attainment of PSO 3 is through

- ◆ Book reviews by students which makes them appreciate the style of the writer, his or
 her cognitive thinking and the various social cultural nuances of the myriad genres
 that are characteristic of today's writing. (ELL 2201, ELL 4201 ELL 6201)
- ➡ Mini Project on Phonetics where the students transcribe the words and sentences and become and learn Syllable structure with Intonation. They also read out thereby enhancing their pronunciation, style of speaking and identifying flaws in Stress and Intonation. (ELL 2201, ELL 5201 ELL 5202). These skills enable them to become English Language Trainers, Content writers and other jobs which require in-depth competencies of English language.

Overall level of Attainment for PSO 3: 80.3%

PSO 4: Develop a passion for literature and language. They will appreciate literature's ability to elicit feeling, cultivate the imagination, and call us to account as humans. They will cultivate their capacity to judge the aesthetic and ethical value of literary texts – Global, Indian, American and British and be able to articulate the standards behind their judgments.

English Literature in general aims at learning to attend to the complexities of literary texts helping students become more active and critical readers to cultivate an imaginative openness to others' experiences, and to call us to account as humans. This is attained through all the Courses of English Literature which result in students becoming more career ready in creative and academic fields. (ELL1201, ELL2201 ELL3201, ELL4201 ELL5201, ELL5202 ELL6201, ELL-A1-6201, ELL-A2-6202, ELL-A3-6203)

Overall of Level of Attainment for PSO 4: 83.4%

Level of attainment measurement

Level of attainment of course outcomes includes both direct and indirect assessments. Direct assessment is done by testing the knowledge and/or skills of the student in that course by conducting standardised examinations. In indirect assessment we use the student feedback on course which is measured on 5-point scale. The sum of these two assessments is shown as the level of attainment of that course.

Assessment of all the theory courses is done in two parts, namely by formative assessment (40%) which is internal and summative assessment (60%) which is external. The evaluation of 100% of the assessment in each semester is distributed as follows:

Mid Semester Examination 1 15% (which is offline)

Mid Semester Examination 2 15% (which is online)

Accessory Assessment 5% (Book Reviews, Article writing, Assignment etc.)

Attendance 5% (above 75% attendance will be rewarded)

End semester examination 60% (which is descriptive)
