The department of History, St Joseph's college for women (A) seeks to serve B.A program students interested in careers related to History. The department offers History combination with economics and political science (HEP). A total of 10 theory papers are offered along with clusters.

PSO-1: Students gained knowledge in the core areas of Indian history (ancient, medieval, modern period)

PSO2: Developed skills helpful in the study and understanding of Historical events (Map Record, Models preparation).

PSO3: Developed interests in the study of (History) and also to work collectively as a member of a team.

PSO-1: Students gained knowledge in the core areas of Indian history (ancient, medieval, modern period)

Assessment Methodology:

PSO1 direct method of computing PSO1 attainment is based on the student performance in all assessment namely offline subjective and objective tests for all the course offered. HIS1301, HIS2301, HIS3301, HIS4301, HIS5302. These exams tests students learning at knowledge, understanding and application levels in the respective courses. Indirect method of computing PSOs is done through student course exit survey where in a structured questionnaire is administered to the student and their response is solicited on a 5 point scale. Responses are consolidated and student satisfaction level with reference to course transactions is computed. Average percentage of level of attainments of all the courses in History is given below.

Assessment of all the theory courses is done in two parts namely by formative assessment 40% which is internal and summative assessment 60% which is external. The evaluation of 100% of the assessment in each semester is distribute as follow

Mid semester-1 15% offline

Mid semester 2 15% online

Accessory assessment 5% assignment, written quiz

Attendance 5%

End semester exam 60% descriptive

Level of attainment of PSO1 (all theory courses offered by the department): 81%

PSO2: Developed skills helpful in the study and understanding of Historical events (Map Record, Models preparation).

PSO2 attainment level is ascertained by continuous assessment for 5% throughout the semester. This assessment involves testing student's knowledge on demonstrating the historical aspects through map record in Indian Kingdoms, and models preparation on Historical Art and Architecture.

Level of attainment of map pointing skills and model making skills: 100%

PSO3: Developed interests in the study of (History) and also to work collectively as a member of a team.

Attainment of PSO3 is ascertained through the course HisA16301, HisA26302, HisA36303 by assessing the project. This project work provides an opportunity for the student to apply knowledge and skills obtained in Tourism theory course work. From a list of Historical, and Native Places given by department student choose on topic for study based on their own interest. Students do individual and Group projects form teams of 3 to 4 members and plan and execute the task. The study is followed by collective report submission and individual oral presentation through power point. Attainment of this learning outcome is ensured and assessed by the concerned faculty member at every stage through direct as well as indirect guidance and monitoring.
