- ☛ To focus on all relevant student issues determined by current events by taking into consideration the suggestions of committee members

- ☛ To encourage students to express their grievances by providing them a platform to express their problems and redress grievances of students brought to the notice of the authorities
- ☛ To provide the right opportunities for all round development&encourage healthy practices of student support and progression
- ☛ To guide, mentor and counsel them for future careers

Functions
